INTRODUCTION

The Health Promotion Committee, as constituted by management of Nurses and Midwives Training College with the mandate of ensuring the following;

- 1. Good Sanitation on Campus
- 2. Environmental beautification/ greening of the campus
- 3. Health education/promotion in NMTCT, the Tamale metropolis and beyond.

The Committee for the second semester of the 2017/2018 academic year set to carry out the following Health Promotion Activities;

- 1. Training and Implementation of effective Handwashing
- 2. Corporate Health Screening and Deworming Exercise
- 3. Reproductive Health Education Campaign at NMTC campus

TRAINING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF EFFECTIVE HANDWASHING

The first phase of the health promotion programme for this semester was Training and Implementation of effective Handwashing which entailed;

- 1. Workshop on effective handwashing for Tutors of the college
- 2. Training on effective handwashing for members of the Health Promotion Club and the entire student body
- 3. Implementation of effective handwashing in the college

The program was implemented by the Health Promotion Committee in collaboration with the Research, Ethics and Quality Assurance Committee and the Gender, Guidance and Counselling Committee. It was a Three-Day Workshop that saw a demonstration on Effective Handwashing by a facilitator from the Northern Regional Team of Infection Prevention and Control, who is also a Tutor of the college, among other activities.

Introduction

The committees for Health Promotion, Research, Quality Assurance and Ethics as well as Gender and Counselling embarked on a 3-day joint workshop as part of their scheduled programme of activities for this semester.

This workshop was organized from 7th to 9th March, 2018 at the Tutors Office, Nurses' and Midwives' Training College, Tamale.

Opening

The workshop was opened by Mr. Abdulai Abdul-Malik, the acting Principal of the college at 9.00 am after an opening prayer was said by Mr. Godwin, a national service person. In his welcome address the Principal reminded participants about the importance of the workshop and how it would impact on the output of Tutors (Participants). He mentioned that he commissioned the research by the research/ethics/quality assurance committee in order for the college to lead the way in publishing articles and materials of relevance in both local and international journals. He also emphasized the need for the hand hygiene and gender session, as it would enhance output by staff in general and tutors to be specific.

He thus expressed importance of the workshop and urged the participants to take seriously the training.

DAY ONE

Presentation and demonstration on Hand Hygiene

The first day, 7th March 2018 saw the presentation of on Hand Hygiene by a facilitator/ Tutor, Mr. Awudu Bawa Iddrisu. In all about 43 Participants attended the day's session. It was generally on why hand hygiene is important in healthcare settings and the consequences of not adhering to hand hygiene guidelines, different types of hand hygiene methods and identifying circumstances under which each can be deployed, also how to do routine hand washing, hygienic hand washing, antiseptic hand rub, and surgical hand scrub and then demonstrating the different types of hand hygiene methods. Before the presentation, a pretest was done to establish the baseline upon which the facilitator built on. This was done by asking participants to demonstrate how they wash their hands, and by this he took note of how participants usually wash their hands.

After the presentation, the facilitator then demonstrated to participants the effective and proper way to wash hands. He then conducted a post test to see if participants learnt how to effectively wash their hands after the demonstration.

The workshop came to a close on Wednesday, the 9th of March, 2018 and a closing address was conducted by the 2nd vice principal, Mrs. Christiana Amalba. In her remarks she advised participants to support management in order for them to deliver on proper administration of the school. She added that tutors should take such workshops serious because it would have much impact on how they deliver and manage their students both in the classroom and outside of it. She thanked participants for coming and urged them to keep it up by attending all meetings and school functions. A closing prayer was done by Mr. Fadel, a national service person.

Participants Evaluation of the Workshop

Participants general made good observations about the workshop and appreciated that fact that there were practical sessions coupled with the presentations made. They also made suggestions as to the themes for future workshops which includes; personal hygiene, CPR, Steps in guidance and counselling, etc.

CORPORATE HEALTH SCREENING AND DEWORMING EXERCISE

The aim of the programme was to ensure a healthy community devoid of preventable communicable and non-communicable diseases. The committee together with the Health Promotion Club moved to corporate institutions in the Tamale metropolis and assessed the health status of the people and also distributed dewormers to participants. Areas covered include blood pressure, BMI and counseling where necessary. Also health education on salient health issues proceeded each screening session. The exercise also included distribution of Albendazole 400mg to the participants screened.

Corporate institutions covered in this exercise include GT BANK, BARCLAYS BANK, NYOHINI CHILDREN'S HOME, NORTHERN REGIONAL COORDINATING COUNCIL among others. This surely enhanced the college's relationship with these institutions and hopefully may ease the committee's access to sponsorships and partnerships in the implementation of its activities. In all, a total of 246 people benefited from the corporate screening exercise

CONCLUSION

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Alternative sources of funding should be explored to augment the little funds
 coming from the college. This should be done through appeals and fundraising
 activities. Also, sponsorships and partnerships can be sought and used to achieve
 this.
- 2. Funds for the committee's activities should be released in whole as and when needed to forestall any delays in implementation of the activities budgeted for.
- 3. Tools and equipment needed to carry out activities of the committee should be provided and a designated office/ accommodation be established to house them.
- 4. More collaborations should be established to help cater for fallouts from activities of the committee, like referrals in terms of health screening carried out.
- 5. Also, experts/ specialists who are engaged by the committee should be remunerated appropriately and accordingly to ensure their availability in subsequent programmes.
- Issuing of certificates of participation to Team participants (Experts/ Tutors and Students) should continue so as to motivation them to continues to support the committee.

It is our fervent hope that if these recommendations are implemented, he work of the committee would be enhanced and its objectives achieved.
